Lion and Tiger Cubs:

Kindergarten & 1st Grade

Lion and Tiger Cubs is a one-on-one program for youth and adults

- Each youth/adult is a member of a Den which has five to eight youth/adult members, they meet a few times each month
- Each den has a Den Leader (usually a parent) who helps coordinate the Den Meetings.
- Each youth/adult team takes a turn at shared leadership



2nd-5th Grade

Cub Scouting is a family centered program

- ♦ The Den is led by a Den Leader (usually a parent), who is assisted by a assistant Den Leader
- ♦ Den Meetings include games, crafts, skits, songs , ceremonies and periodic field trips

Your child is a member of a Pack which:

- Is made up of one or more dens.
- Meets once a month at the Pack meeting –all Cub Scout families are expected to participate.
- ♦ The Pack meeting is led by the Cubmaster.


Our Pack is run by the Pack Committee

- Made up of Den leaders, Pack leaders and Parents. The committee meets once a month and is led by the Committee Chairman.
- The Committee selects leadership, finds meeting places, performs record keeping, manages Pack finances, orders badges, maintains Pack equipment, helps train leaders and plans activities.

How Can YOU help?

Scouting operates through volunteer leadership. Volunteer leaders are an example of Scouting's principle of service to others.

Naturally, parents are the primary source of leaders in the Scouting program. You volunteer not only to serve Scouting, but also to help your child and their friends, to have the chance to be a positive influence on the youth in your community.

POSITIONS IN THE PACK

DEN/ WEBELOS LEADERS

Leads the den meetings and attends the monthly pack meetings. Attends the monthly pack leaders' meeting.

CUBMASTER

Helps plan and carry out the pack program, with the help of the pack committee. Emcees the monthly pack meeting and attends the pack leaders' meeting.

COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN

Presides at all pack committee meetings, helps recruit adult leaders, and attends pack meetings.

SECRETARY/TREASURER


Keeps all records for the pack, including pack bank account, financial records, etc. Attends pack meetings and pack leaders' meetings.

ADVANCEMENT CHAIRMAN

Maintains advancement records for the pack. Orders and obtains all badges and insignia. Attends pack meetings and committee meetings.

PARENT HELPERS

"One shot" program jobs such as coordinating pack participation in Popcorn sales events, Scouting for Food, pinewood derby, blue and gold banquet, day camp, etc. These jobs are of short duration.



Youth Protection Training



The Boy Scouts of America places the greatest importance on creating the most secure environment possible for our youth members. This training covers the BSA's Youth Protection policies, kinds of abuse, how to respond to disclosure of abuse, and proper reporting procedures. It does so by taking you through situations that require choices and produce consequences. This training is available online and in each district throughout the year. In order for an adult to remain a registered leader in the Boy Scouts of America, Youth Protection Training is required every two years.

Job Specific Training



In-depth information for a new leader in a specific leadership position such as Den Lead er, Cubmaster, etc. This course is presented a few times a year in your district or at the council level.
